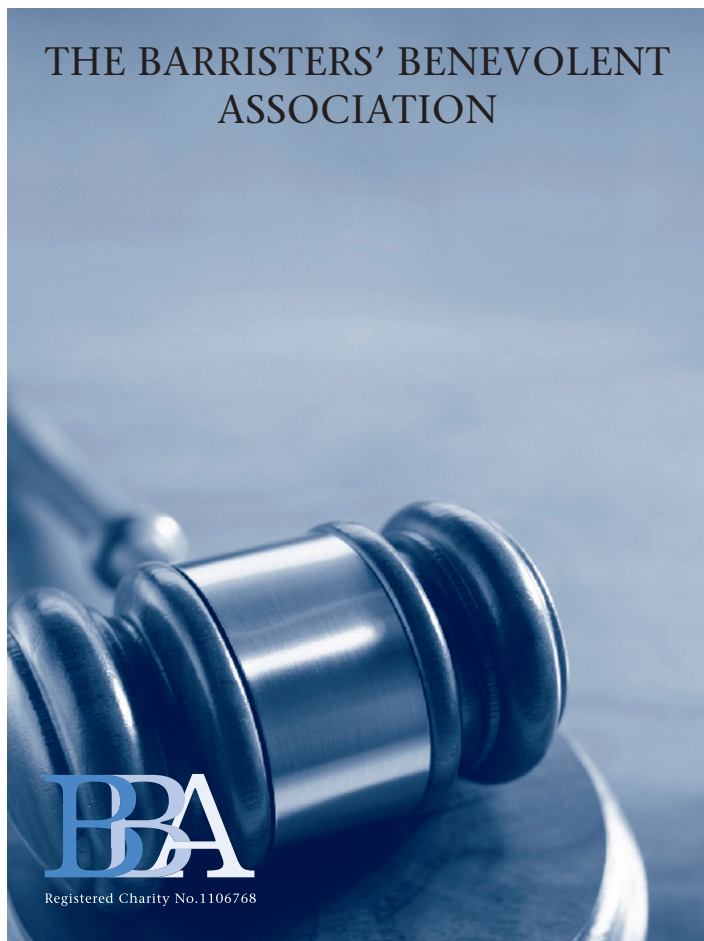

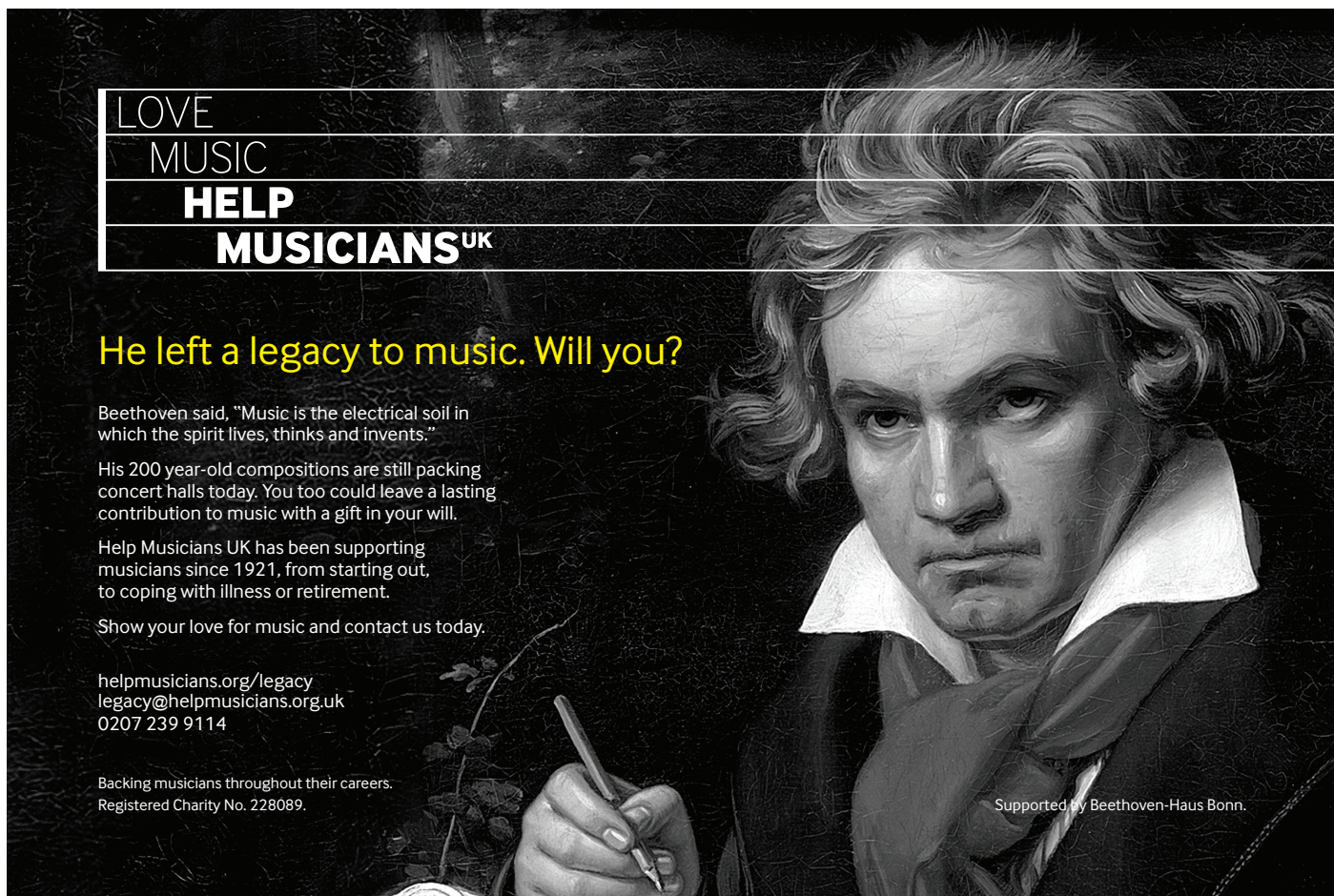

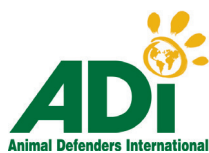

Others who, like Lord Whisky, have special needs remain at the Sanctuary for the rest of their lives, enjoying the lovely Kent countryside. The charity receives no government funding and relies entirely on donations and legacies to continue its contribution to helping animals and owners.

The aims are adhered to without exception and the interest of each individual animal is our primary concern. Expediency is never a consideration and each animal is welcome to stay in our care for as long as it takes for that special home to come. We make no apology for looking for the right homes for each animal and not animals for people. This does, of course, work to the advantage of the new owner.

No animal accepted is ever destroyed.



Since flying its first mission in 1991, the charity has now responded to over 46,000 incidents, averaging 2,000 missions each year. If a patient reaches hospital within 60 minutes of injury (known as the Golden Hour), their chances of survival are dramatically increased. All areas of the region are accessible in 19 minutes and 90% of the region is accessible within eight minutes.

Each year it costs in excess of £7 million to maintain the three air-craft and the provision of a life saving service. Each air ambulance mission costs an average of £2,500. The charity receives no funding from the Government or National Lottery so relies entirely on the support and generosity of local people and businesses.

Specialist veterinary treatment is given as required with follow up care carried out by trained people. Swans are released back to the wild after treatment with permanently disabled swans being found sheltered homes on private lakes.
